Our work in 2015

1 The Kathleen Syme Library and Community Centre Working Group Convenor: Greta Bird

CRA led ten year intense community campaign: rallies, letterboxing, emails, lobbying politicians

Vibrant, centrally located Library and Community Centre

Over 700 people use the library per day. Over 200 meetings held per month.

The KSLCC was opened in July 2015. Without the CRA and the great work of Greta Bird on behalf of the CRA, the Kathleen Syme Centre would not be Carlton's Library and Community Centre. It would instead be part of Melbourne University's ever expanding empire.

Greta has annoyed politicians and bureaucrats from the local to federal level, but that has been a marker of her effectiveness. This achievement will be enjoyed for many years to come.

The City of Melbourne has done an excellent job in converting and renovating the building, so that it is by far their most pleasant library, enjoying great patronage, enhanced by the pleasant and helpful staff and the excellent Wild Timor Coffee Company Café.

2 Planning

Working Group Convenor: Warren Green

Reviewed over 150 planning proposals affecting Carlton

Kept residents informed of changes to planning scheme and facilitated input into planning reviews Two significant wins at VCAT halting inappsropriate development in Carlton

The CRA Planning Working Group (Warren Green, Ewan Ogilvy, Malcolm Foo, Denis Toth & John Weickhardt) has analysed planning issues and represented CRA at a number of VCAT cases. The year was marked by several VCAT decisions supporting objections by the CRA, City of Melbourne and individual objectors.

CRA has been a key part of two significant wins at VCAT in 2015. The first was the refusal to permit construction of the proposed thirteen storey apartment block at the Downtowner Motel site (66-68 Lygon St). Not only did the proposal exceed the eight storey limit of the area but also proposed small one or two bedroom apartments with inadequate light and ventilation. The second win was the 23-33 Lincoln Square South site where VCAT also upheld the council decision to refuse a permit—a welcome if unexpected win.

3 Traffic, Transport and Parking Working Group, Convenor: Ian Bird

CRA alerted the Council Engineering Department of the high volume and excessive speed of traffic in Kay Street Traffic survey showed weekday traffic averaged more than 10 times that generated locally with some vehicles travelling as fast as 83km/hr

The Department reenforced 'No Entry' restrictions to Nicholson Street and will consult the community on the introduction of speedhumps along Kay Street

Members of the CRA were at the forefront in opposing the East-West Link, which was cancelled by the new State Government. Ian and Greta Bird were chief organisers of the CRA's opposition to the Link.

The group also monitored other traffic and transport proposals that can impact on Carlton including:

- Western Distributor
- Melbourne Metro Rail
- Victorian State transport infrastructure projects budget allocation

4 Carlton Gardens Working Group Convenor: Brian Falconer

CRA worked with Federal Member and community members on Royal Exhibition Building campaign Allocation of over \$20 million of federal funds to refurbish the public viewing deck

Plan for refurbishment work to be complete in 2018

Our Federal Member Adam Bandt worked with CRA and members of the community to encourage the allocation of \$20m by the Federal Government to reinstate the public viewing deck of the Royal Exhibition Building. In the 19th century the promenade deck provided the best view of Melbourne.

Four years have since passed since then and the work has progressed slowly. We hope that this work will be completed in two years.
