WHAT ARE THE REASONS FOR YOUR OBJECTION?

The CRA objects to this development on heritage, traffic and safety grounds.

HOW WILL YOU BE AFFECTED BY THE GRANT OF A PERMIT?

The Carlton Residents Association advocates on behalf of its members to preserve heritage values and amenity in Carlton by the preservation and maintenance of existing buildings and streetscapes and sympathetic development.

CRA is of the opinion that the nature of the ongoing use of the subject property does not generate a need to provide for on-site loading/unloading. Provision of a kerbside unloading bay should adequately address the future needs, post renovations.

CRA believes that a heritage assessment of this proposal should be commissioned.

Specific concerns of CRA relate to:

1. The detrimental impact that the proposal would have on the landscaped grounds of the church, which are an integral part of the heritage property.
