


1. How long has Carlton been home?


2. Why choose Carlton?

A mixture of all reasons continues to be reflected in the 'other' responses.


2. What is the main reason you initially chose to live in Carlton?



All key areas of current CRA focus.


5. Benefits of joining the CRA?



Mobility and services follow behind with one third selecting these for focus.


6. Which of these are your top 3 concerns for focus in Carlton?


CRA is delivering
